News from the Park Hills Police and Tips for a Safe Holiday Season

With the holiday season approaching, we know our residents will be visiting their friends and relatives. We want to remind you to be sure all doors and windows in your home are locked when you leave. Make sure there are lights left on in your home while you are gone; make use of timers if possible. You want your house to look as though someone is there. Also, if you have an alarm system, activate it. Tell a neighbor you will be gone and ask them to keep an eye out for anything strange. Call police IMMEDIATELY if they see anything suspicious, DON'T WAIT UNTIL LATER TO CALL, it may be too late then.

Also, winter will soon be upon us. Portions of our Snow Emergency Ordinance are published below as a reminder to our residents of the procedures to follow:

A Snow Emergency shall be declared at such time that it is determined that falling snow, sleet or freezing rain requires restriction of vehicular traffic for the purpose of plowing or cleaning the snow or ice.

**NO PARKING ON CITY STREETS WHEN
SNOW EXCEEDS THREE (3) INCHES OR
DURING A DECLARED SNOW EMERGENCY.**

A vehicle parked on the pavement or right of way of any dedicated street at the time the Snow Emergency is declared shall be removed from the street within three (3) hours if the Snow Emergency is declared between 6:00 a.m. & 8:00 p.m. If declared between 8:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., the vehicle shall be removed prior to 9:00 a.m. of that morning.


