

News from the City of Park Hills

If you own a dog or cat and live in the City of Park Hills, you should be aware of some of the ordinances regarding animals. This is not a complete list, but the situations for which we receive the most complaints:

90.02 (F)(G)

All dogs and cats kept, harbored or maintained in the City of Park Hills, Kentucky, shall be licensed and registered with said city. (\$5.00 annually)

90.03 (A)(B) Running at Large Prohibited

Every owner, harbored or person having the custody, control or possession of any dog or cat shall keep such dog or cat confined to the premises and property of said owner, harbored or custodian except as hereinafter provided.

No owner, harbored or person having the custody, control or possession of any dog or cat shall permit, allow or suffer such dog or cat: (1) to run or be at large as hereinbefore defined; (2) to go about or on the premises or property of any other person within the city without the permission of such other person.

90.05 (A)(B)(D) Keeping of Animals as Public Nuisances Prohibited

No owner, harbored or person having the custody, control or possession of any dog or cat shall permit such dog or cat to disturb the peace and quiet of the neighborhood by reason of their howling, barking and whining, the stench they cause, unsanitary conditions in which they are kept, or their disturbing of people in the reasonable use and enjoyment of property where any of these facts cause annoyance, discomfort or injury to the health and welfare of persons in the neighborhood.

No person shall allow a dog under his/her control to be upon public property or upon property of another, absent the consent of the owner or occupant of the property without some device for the removal and containment of such dog's excrement; nor shall any person fail to remove any excrement deposited by any dog under his/her control on public property or private property of another absent the consent of the owner or occupant of said property.

Whoever violates this section shall be fined in the sum not more than Fifty (\$50.00).
