# UNITED STATES CENSUS 2000

The City Clerk's Office would like to share some facts about why filling out your census questionnaire is so important.

- Over \$180 billion dollars is distributed annually on the basis of Census counts - over \$620 is lost per year for EACH household of 4 **not counted**. Local Governments (that's us!) and community organizations then lose money for important projects and programs.
- Virtually ALL decision-making activities rely on Census counts. Local Governments use the info in the planning of road and other project improvements, development of community facilities (such as schools) and other funding decisions.
- Census 2000 determines political representation at the state and federal level.
- In 1990, only 71% of Park Hills residents participated in the Census (most of our cities had over 80% participation).... Let's show our surrounding cities that we do care about the importance of **BEING COUNTED!**
- Every personal visit by a Census worker costs \$36 and the workers have gone back up to six times...this is Federal Tax dollars being wasted.

**If you are worried about confidentiality with your personal information, here are some interesting facts most people don't know:**

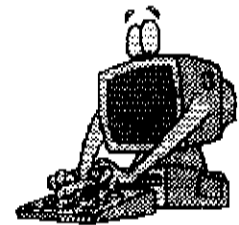
- Individual information captured in Census 2000 is not shared with anyone for any reason.
- Personal information is not disclosed to anyone. Only aggregate data is published for report.
- Census 2000 information is not shared with the IRS, the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Welfare, FBI, or any law enforcement agency.
- No one, no matter how high the authority, not even the President, can obtain individual information.
- No other federal, state, or local agency has access to the individual info you provide in Census 2000.

- **AND HERE'S THE BIG ONE:** Only limited information from the next Census will be released in 72 years and may be used by all citizens for genealogical and historical research.
- All Census workers can be fined \$5,000 and receive a five year prison term for giving out any information they see on a form.

**Make a pledge to do your "civic duty".... LOOK FOR YOUR CENSUS FORM TO BE DELIVERED BEGINNING IN MID-MARCH, and remember, it only occurs every ten years!**
