Like many, I've made attempts in my life not to take things for granted so much anymore and therefore savor life, make it go slower. I looked around saw that my fellow citizens and myself are, while forever changed because of recent and historical events which cause the loss of our loved ones, still able to enjoy everything we always have on the Memorial Days since I've been alive. I was struck that this year, although not for the first time, my country was in a state of war, and yet I could feel so safe, lucky, blessed. This year, like Mr. Schlothauer, I thought that the adaptation of the 'Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag' was a special piece when you *really* took

the time to listen to what was being said.

Which brings me back to his letter of thanks printed above that is in a degree of detail that I did not expect. I have long appreciated the dedication he must have for taking on such a difficult chore, but I never really thought about all that he and his committee do every year to perpetually allow me to enjoy that day in this town. Mr. Schlothauer's words say a lot about him too. If you notice, he thanked everybody. At the end, he even thanked you and me. Thank *you* David!
