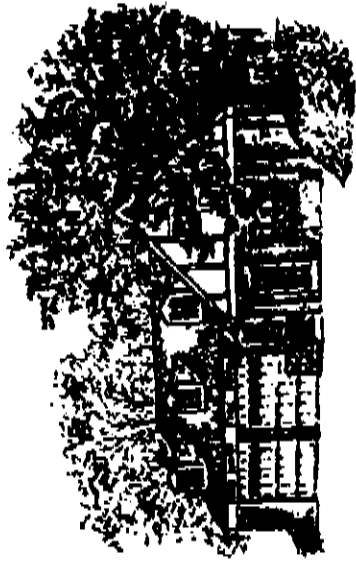

The City of Park Hills and the Park Hills Civic Association are sponsoring the 2003 Park Hills Memorial Day Parade, on Monday, May 26th. The Parade forms at the Covington Campus of Northern Kentucky University, (off Dixie Hwy. in Park Hills) at 10:45am, and concludes at the intersection of Amsterdam Rd. and Park Dr. in Park Hills.

Parade Start Time: 11:30am sharp.

Parade Route: The Parade route includes School Campus Parking lot to Mount Allen to Arlington, to Dixie Highway, to St. James, to Old State Road, to Terrace, to Amsterdam Road, to Rose Circle, and concludes at the intersection of Amsterdam Road and Park Drive.

Parade Entries: The Parade numbers over 100 entries, and includes floats, marching bands, horses, antique cars, fire trucks, police cruisers, school groups, boy scouts, girl scouts, cub scouts, brownies, military vehicles and much more.

Flag Raising Ceremonies: At the conclusion of the Parade, there will be a flag raising ceremony. State Representative Jon Draud will present to the City of Park Hills a flag that has recently flown over our nation's capital. Kenton County Judge Executive Dick Murgatroyd will assist Park Hills' Mayor Michael Hellmann and Police Chief Rick Smith in the flag raising ceremonies.

Music Program: Jeanette Koch, a student and vocalist from Dixie High School, under the direction of Elizabeth Hickerson, the Choral Director at Dixie, will sing several patriotic songs during the ceremonies.

Parade Music: This year's parade features the marching Colonels of Dixie High School, under the direction of Ed Asuncion. With more than 100 students, the Band is an award winning band and continues the tradition of excellence at Dixie High School.

Garden Club Bake Sale: A bake sale sponsored by the Park Hills Garden Club will open for business prior to the parade at the corner of Amsterdam and Park Drive. Please bring your cakes, pies and goodies for sale, as the proceeds support our Garden Club's activities. There will also be bottled water, coffee, and lemonade.

Park Hills Vision 2006 committee has met monthly in keeping with its goal to coordinate the goals and activities of the Civic Association, Avant Gardeners, Tree Board, City Council and Mayor. Spring has been a beautiful season in our city. If you have enjoyed the crocus, hyacinths, tulips and daffodils, and giant alliums blooming in the Trolley Park area and around the flagpole, summer throughout the City of Park Hills should be just as spectacular.

We have identified twenty-seven areas in the City to be planted and maintained by volunteers. In some cases entire streets have been together to "adopt" planters. Small signs placed in the designated areas identify the public garden volunteers. At a preliminary meeting in early April, volunteers met over coffee and continental breakfast and discussed guidelines for these public plantings. Some volunteers have already begun weeding and tidying up "their" landscape areas in anticipation of after final frost planting. On May 17 at 10:00 A.M. to noon in Trolley Park, the Avant gardeners will provide annuals, fertilizer and mulch so that the areas can be planted in time for our Memorial Day Parade.



May is beautification month in Park Hills. We are working on the repair of stone planters in the City. The Civic Association has ordered four picnic tables for the playground area. The Busy Bee's butterfly garden has been outlined and the new street signs are going up first along the Memorial Day parade route. Residents are encouraged to beautify their yards by removing debris, mowing and replanting. If you have a new street sign in your yard, consider landscaping the area around it so that everyone driving by can enjoy it.

The members of Vision 2006 are committed to the preservation of the charming neighborhood atmosphere of Park Hills and to the support of our local businesses. We urge you to join your neighbors at our various citywide events during the summer months. Walk or drive around the city and see the areas your friends and neighbors

The other night I watched as one of our recently released POWs was interviewed on television. He told how happy he was to be back home and thanked his hometown for their outpouring of support. He emphasized that he loves his community, family, friends, and neighbors, and that he never wants to live anywhere else. The soldier noted that he still lives in the same home he grew up in, and said that he was most fortunate to live in such a great place. I understood exactly what he meant because like him, I live in such a community. When my family first moved to Park Hills it felt like we had stepped into a Norman Rockwell painting. Each season and holiday seems to be marked by a civic event: the Easter Egg Hunt, The Memorial Day Parade, Spring Dinner Dance, The City Picnic, the fall Garden Tour, Luminary Night with horse drawn carriages, residents singing Christmas carols and a Christmas Party for the kids with what looks to be the real Mr. and Mrs. Claus. Driving through town, you're likely to see volunteers tending flowerbeds, sprucing up the park, or decorating Christmas trees. Volunteer firemen and rescue squad members help keep us safe.

On our street, for as long as anyone can remember, the ladies of Rose Circle have their annual after Christmas Coffee. Our dearly loved neighbor, Margie Hurley has lived in her house on Rose Circle for over sixty years and has hosted this event until a couple of years ago she turned it over to Mary Meyers. Rose Circle like most other Park Hills streets has a mixture of all ages, and children grow up with the wonderful influence of caring neighbors. Recently some of the ladies in town formed a Rosary Group (Monday night for those interested); I was told that several of them remember doing this during WWI.

I feel very sentimental about my street because our neighbors are like family. When friends I talk with from work hear about life in Park Hills they usually say that they wish that their communities were more like ours. The people of this city are what make it special. In very few other places will you find such a caring and close-knit community. Park Hills is the only home my

children have ever known, where they met their first friends and where I hope one day they will choose to raise their family. The best thing we can do for our children is give them a sense of security and many, many happy childhood memories. In Park Hills, neighbors help each other and watch out for one another. Just look at your photo albums and see how many happy times your family has had over the years at various Park Hills events.

Reminiscing... Memories of Devau Park

Excerpts from writings by Bev Sabinger, who resides in Georgia and is the sister to resident Joe Crowe

...The anticipation and excitement would begin the evening before. Since my mother worked outside of our home, my father would make all of the preparations. This included grocery shopping for all our picnic goodies and any other supplies that we needed. Besides all of the food, we would have to gather together lawn chairs, blankets, bats and balls, and other equipment that we would need for a day-long excursion. My father would then make arrangements for a taxicab to pick us up early the next morning. We did not own a car, so this was our only transportation. So in those days a cab was a treat in itself.....

Arriving so early assured us of the best spot at the park. My parents would immediately set out to prepare our breakfast for us. I can still smell the bacon and eggs cooking on the open fire. We would have fresh cantaloupe and other fresh fruits that we did not normally eat at home, so even our food was a special treat. After breakfast, Mom and Dad would settle themselves on the blankets that we had spread out under the trees to read the Sunday paper. My siblings and I usually started out in different directions to explore the park...we would do a little climbing and we also loved to roll down the hills. What fun! A very simple, wholesome, good time. Times were so different back then.

(After lunch), an afternoon baseball game would always follow. The numbers playing would increase as others would join in the competition. These games would last the rest of the afternoon and sometimes into evening.

Before leaving the park for home, we would roast hotdogs, which were so yummy, and seemed to make our day complete! It was great growing up in a family that was fun to be with... I shall always be grateful for these memories that will always be with me. What a blessing.

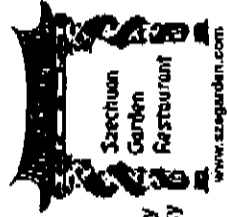
