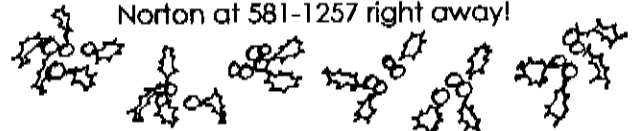


Carriage Rides 2003

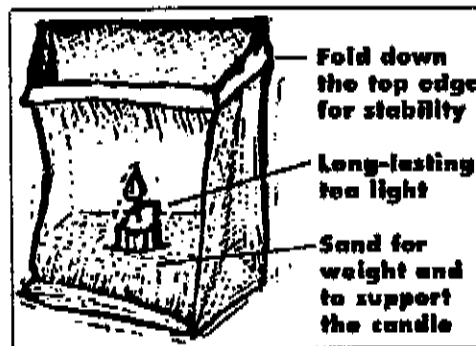

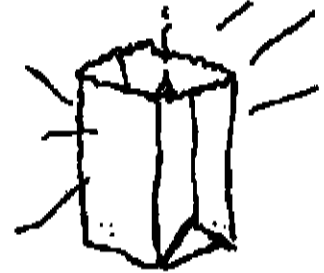

Help us warm up a cold December evening! Join your neighbors as they light up the night during the Park Hills annual tradition of Luminary Night. VISION 2006

As the winter issue of the Hub goes to press, Park Hills' residents are still enjoying the massive flower display in Trolley Park and other planting areas in our city. The committee of Vision 2006, made up of volunteers from the Civic Association, Avant Gardeners, Tree Board, City Council and Mayor, is thrilled at the completion of our goals for this first year.

Within the last two months, the Trolley Park sign has been reinstalled and dramatically landscaped, thanks to the design and installation by Gary Toebbe of the Good Earth. Steve Skidmore, of the new Skyline going into the old Hardees building on Dixie Highway, donated the evergreens. Members of the Avant Gardeners completed the initial plantings. The trolley stop building on Hamilton now has an upgrading of the landscaping, interior lights and new terra cotta pots. A special thanks to Doug Waggoner, a Jackson Road resident and owner of Waggoner Masonry Restoration for donating a crew and the materials to clean the two trolley stop buildings and sidewalk. These charming buildings are the subjects of our first holiday ornament. (See order form enclosed and begin a new holiday tradition for your family.)

Russ Byrd's carving, "The Phoenix" is another addition to our much-used park. (See article in this issue of the HUB) Future plans include lighting of the sculpture and additional outlets to facilitate holiday lighting. We are trying to figure financing for additional lighting in the other trolley stop building, the ash trees in the center of Park Drive, and the area in front of the flagpole.

Please take some time to drive around our city to admire the new planters at two other entrances to Park Hills. The Amsterdam and Sleepy Hollow stone planter has been completely redone and planted with a donated sculpted white pine from Steve Skidmore and plants divided from other city areas. At the corner of St. James and Dixie Highway, we have a new stone planter with plants and flowers installed by the Heists who live on St. James and own Kremer's Market in Villa Hills. Thanks to Barone's Catering for providing water for the planter.

Our spring bulb order is in and volunteers will soon be removing annuals, planting thousands of bulbs and decorating for the holidays so that residents will have a continuing display to admire as they drive and walk throughout our city.

New Work of Art at Trolley Park

Every time you turn around these days, there is something new springing up at Trolley Park! The latest attraction found there is not made of the verified organic matter that has caught the attention of all of our eyes over the past year and a half. It is also not the kind of thing that has grown over time like the plantings do. In fact,

it practically appeared overnight. But it is no surprise that this work still took four and a half months to create. It is a limestone sculpture by Russ Byrd of Park Hills and portrays his interpretation of the Phoenix, the mythological bird, which he felt symbolized the rebirth of the park. "Kind of a rising from the ashes" as the artist put it.

Mr. Byrd moved here in 1973 and has an avid interest in art, philosophy, and nature and seems to have a great appreciation for approaching life as a journey. Calling his work "sculpture" or "art" seems to make Mr. Byrd uncomfortable as he is quick to proclaim that he has no formal training in art and prefers that his work be called "carvings". He says he is a simple man who spent a good part of his life as a railroad brakeman.

Mr. Byrd did his first carving at the age of forty but then went on to do landscape paintings on canvas. It was not until 1992 that he returned to carving. His property has many of his works on-site. He says he has never sold one, but rather gives them as gifts when it just seems right - which is kind of what

happened this summer. People had asked him if he might consider doing a carving for the park. He could not emphasize to me enough how honored he felt to have been asked. After consulting his family and deciding to do it, he set to work on this piece.

Chris Williams, from the Cincinnati Art Museum, who is responsible for bringing exhibits from all over the world to Cincinnati, helped Mr. Byrd with the logistics and proper mounting for the piece which is set near the gathering center. "It is simply amazing the way people want to share their talents, gifts, and time down at the park", says Helen Heil, of the Vision 2006 committee. Indeed, we are all honored to have the sculpture gracing Trolley Park and able to be enjoyed by all!
