MEMORIAL DAY PARADE: Just Around the Corner!

Memorial Day Parade Date: Monday, May 31, 2004.

What time? Parade forms at 10:30am, Monday morning, and the Parade starts promptly at 11:30am.

Where does it form? The Covington Campus of the Northern Kentucky University (Old Chase Law School Campus), off Dixie Highway across from the Ft. Mitchell Garage.

What is the Parade Route? Mount Allen Drive, to South Arlington Road, to Dixie Highway, to St. James Place, to Old State Road, to Terrace Drive, to Amsterdam Road, to Park Drive, to Rose Circle.

What time is the Flag Raising Ceremony? At the conclusion of the parade. US Senator Bunning procures an American Flag that has flown over the nation's capital, and our State Representatives present it to the City.

Where is the Flag Raising Ceremony? At the intersection of Amsterdam Road and Park Drive. The Flag Raising Ceremony includes music, the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, 2004 All Memorial Day Essay contest winners, and other awards.

Who can be in the Parade? All Park Hills businesses and residents and neighbors are invited to join in the Memorial Day activities, and put an entry in the parade. It can be a convertible, pickup truck, new car, decorated with Memorial Day colors, or a decorated theme float on a flat bed truck or trailer, anything available to the businesses or neighbors. Past parade entries include marching bands, music groups, floats, horses, antique cars, neighborhood and business entries, candidates for public office, and State, County, and City Officials.

Luminaria

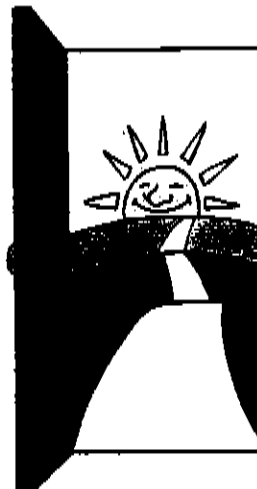

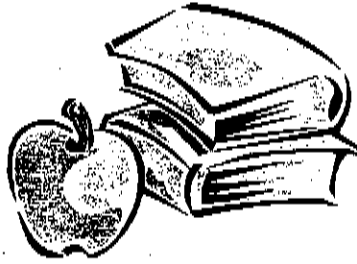

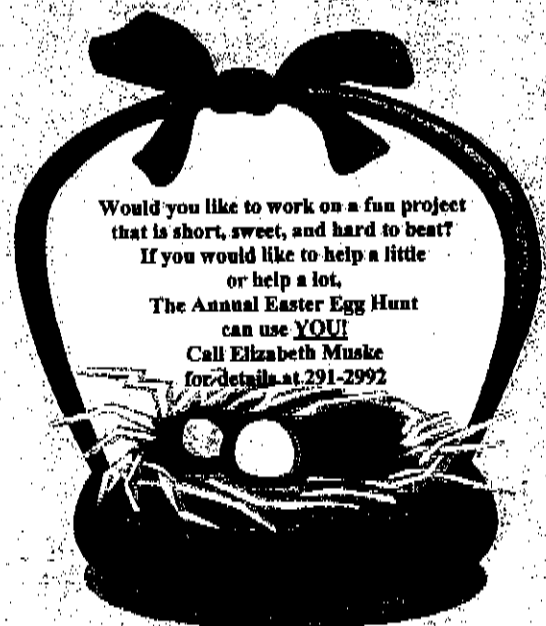
Park Hills Civic Association Children's Christmas Party 2003

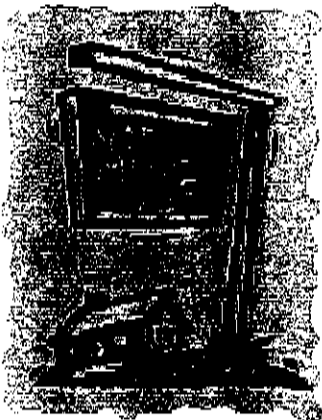

Welcome to the world of Park Hills. This great city was developed in the 1920's and has many wonderful homes in it. Families tend to move in and never leave their home. Some homes that are over 70 years old have only had one owner. Many are on their second or third

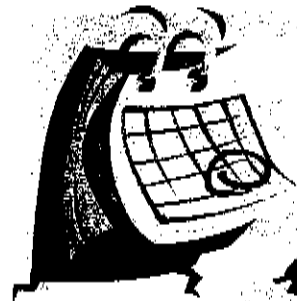
owner. We are the 4th owner of our home, yet, for all practical purposes, people still call it the "Heidt Home".

I guess the good thing is that everyone will probably laugh and say "It's okay, it is just that crazy lady who lives in the Heidt's house!!"
